





- 4. Serve a range of users, including hikers, bicyclists and equestrians.

















Equestrian Trail - Soft Surface










Type 4: Equestrian Rural Streets

Equestrian Rural streets are the minor streets that exist throughout the Equestrian Rural Character District. These streets connect the residents to the Avenues/ Boulevards, and make up the majority of the road network within this District. These streets typically have a dirt roadway surface, allowing for both vehicular and equestrian traffic, though do not include additional amenities, sidewalks or curb and gutter, or public utilities such as water and sewer services.

Type 5: Equestrian Boulevard


The Equestrian Boulevard occurs at one location within the Narcoossee Area, creating a promenade linking the future Historic Town, through the Town Neighborhoods and connecting into the Equestrian Rural District.








Opportunities - Centers

- Historic Town Center:
 - 68,000 SF Neighborhood Center with small grocery store
- Springhead Lake Community Center, and three Neighborhood Centers north of Historic Town:
 - By 2013, 144,000 SF, anchored by a supermarket
 - By 2015, expansion to 328,000 SF community shopping area
- Rummell Road Community Center, and Highway 192 Community/ Employment Center
 - 2013: 189,500 SF Community Center
 - 2018: 432,500 SF Community Center,
 with additional growth at Highway 192
